O'Connor is face of Jamestown 2007

The former Supreme Court justice is named a leader of the events marking the 400th anniversary of America's first permanent English settlement.

WILLIAMSBURG — The nation's first female Supreme Court justice will serve as "the face" of the Jamestown 2007 commemoration, organizers said Tuesday.

Organizers still are in talks with other big names, a Jamestown 2007 spokesman said.

O'Connor is expected to participate in commemoration events such as "America's Anniversary Weekend" on May 11-13, 2007, and the "World Forum on Democracy" on Sept. 16-19, 2007.

She is no stranger to the Williamsburg area. O'Connor serves as the College of William and Mary's chancellor and is a senior trustee for Colonial

Williamsburg Foundation's board of trustees.

"America's traditions of representative government, free enterprise and cultural diversity have their roots at Jamestown," O'Connor said in a release.

"I'm honored to be associated with this important milestone. The commemoration is a rare opportunity for all Americans to better understand the foundations of our nation as we work together to shape our country's future." ■
