

RICHMOND (AP)—A spokesman for deaf Virginians urged anew Thursday that educational facilities for the deaf be separated from those for the blind.

P. Vernon Cherry Jr., president of the Virginia Association for the Deaf, spoke before a committee of the Virginia Advisory Legislative Council studying problems relating to the state schools for the deaf and blind.

"Each school should be able to concentrate its efforts on one program geared to its specific needs," Cherry said.
